Incident Summary	A novel coronavirus (SARS-CoV-2) was first detected in China at the end of 2019. It has now spread to almost every country, with the largest number of cases in the United States. The disease the virus causes has been named "coronavirus disease 2019" (abbreviated "COVID-19").			 An aggressive testing strategy focused on health care staff and certain patients was announced today, 4/29, with an estimated 1,000 tests being performed each day. VDH determined that serologic tests are not yet sufficiently relia for use. Serologic (i.e., antibody) testing reveals not only current but also past COVID-19 infections.

- Frozen meal distribution continued at Northern Vermont partner sites today. Distribution concludes tomorrow in Central Vermont.
- ACCD continues to work in close contact with the Vermont Retail Grocers' Association to monitor supply chain issues. As of 4/29, the supply chain is in good shape outside of bread, sugar, bath tissue, sanitizer, and cleaning products which remain strained.
- · Concern is rising over the impact of meat plant closures on the beef, pork, and chicken supply chain. Supply is plentiful for now, but distributors are looking towards alternative sources to plan for future shortages.
- VAAFM are working to explore a Vermont-based proposal to the recently launched USDA Farmers to Families Food Box program.

AOT is staffing border crossings for the State's monitoring of traffic mobility to determine how effective mitigation measures are for reducing travel and also to give healthcare leaders a sense of future healthcare capacity needs.
