Food, Water, Sheltering	Current Situation	<ul> <li>On Friday, 5/8, the Vermont Foodbank and the Vermont National Guard distributed 3,312 cases (or 52,992 meals) of MREs at the Allen Brook School in Williston.</li> <li>All the Vermont-based food distribution businesses that applied to the USDA were awarded grants to support the Coronavirus Emergency Food Assistance Program. These awards will be to create food boxes for the Vermont Foodbank to disseminate to Vermonters from May through the fall.</li> <li>VAAFM and the Vermont Department of Tourism and Marketing have pooled available resources to release a \$20,000 request for proposal for showcasing Vermont food and beverage products via social media. Bids are due on May 15<sup>th</sup>.</li> </ul>	Key Information
	Future	<ul> <li>Shelf-stable boxed meal distributions are being scheduled starting the second week of May. Distributions will occur at 8 sites across 8 counties over a two week period. Dates will be confirmed once supply delivery dates are finalized.</li> </ul>	
Transportation	<b>Current Situation</b>	<ul> <li>AOT is staffing border crossings for the State's monitoring of traffic mobility to determine how effective mitigation measures are for reducing travel and also to give healthcare leaders a sense of future healthcare capacity needs. ## Lifelines: Impacts and Actions

- One Alternate Care Site is currently operable in Chittenden County with three other sites on standby. The Chittenden County site has one COVID-19 positive patient, and four non-COVID-19 patients. • Beginning the week of 5/11, the branch will reinforce the use of the eight Steris V-PRO units among healthcare workers and first responders around the hospitals, to further conserve the supply of already scarce N-95 respirators.
- HOC/VDH is setting up pop-up COVID-19 testing sites for healthcare workers, first responders, and childcare providers on Tuesday in Bennington, on Thursday in Brattleboro, and on Saturday in White River Junction. <u>Registration</u> is required. More such testing for the Offense-minded Testing Strategy is planned for the next several weeks.

Future	<ul> <li>An offense-minded testing strategy focused on health care staff and certain patients was announced 4/29, with an estimated 1,000 tests being performed each day. Additional personnel, equipment, and testing supplies may be needed due to the increase in testing.</li> <li>The Medical Logistics Branch and the SNS Warehouse are in the process of coordinating PPE and equipment support for the new pop-up testing sites scheduled to take place in the coming weeks.</li> <li>Additional guidance will be forthcoming later this week to allow for some additional healthcare providers such as physical therapists and chiropractors to resume operations in a limited capacity.</li> </ul>
