Background / Current Situation

On June 10, 2020 the Vermont State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC) was partially activated from 0800 to 1600, using a completely virtual structure. The SEOC will be partially activated every day until further notice.

Key Updates:

- The next meal distribution will be held on Thursday, June 11th in the Brattleboro Area. The following distribution will be on Friday, June 12th in the Morristown area. Pre-registration is required.

- At today's press conference, Governor Phil Scott said that he fully expects Vermont primary and secondary schools to offer in-person instruction in the fall. Agency of Education (AOE) Secretary Dan French said there will be daily health checks for staff and students, among other new public health measures. AOE will also work to strengthen the state's capacity for remote learning as a contingency.

6/8-6/9 Call Statistics from 211:

- 211 received 91 calls related to COVID-19 on Monday and Tuesday. The vast majority of calls were from the general public (82 calls).
- The most common call topics were travel (31 calls), basic needs (30 calls), and the executive order (26 calls) (topics are not mutually exclusive, i.e., calls can touch on multiple topics).

Additional Updates:

- The Child Development Division is researching suppliers for gloves, hand sanitizer, and cleaning materials for childcare providers for large quantity purchases.
- The Agency of Education is working with the Department of Health on guidance for reopening schools and a resource request for school food service programs.

- The Department of Buildings and General Services (BGS) requested 720 cloth masks for state custodial workers.
- A Resource Request Form is being completed for a soap donation.

Agency of Transportation (AOT):

- AOT is assisting with food distribution at in the Middlebury Area today and in Brattleboro tomorrow.
- AOT is making deliveries of PPE around the state.

Vermont National Guard (VTNG):

- VTNG continues to support food distribution and pop-up testing sites through June 19h.
- VTNG is supporting demobilization of the Alternate Care Site at the UVM Medical Center.

Department of Human Resources (DHR):

- Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) medical volunteer activity:
 - 125 volunteers total, 84 currently activated
 - MRC volunteers are being scheduled to serve as DMV Screeners
 - North County Hospital has changed their volunteer request from help administer tests to help with screening.

Building and General Service (BGS):

- BGS continues to support food distribution by sourcing temporary restrooms and law enforcement coverage for the week of 6/15.
- BGS is sourcing 7 more cases of gallon containers for hand sanitizer.

Other Updates:

- The branch is looking into how best to support the PPE needs of municipalities as they hold elections.
- The return of portable hospital trailer is being coordinated. The trailer is due to be returned on 6/11.
- There was a request to demobilize the UVM Medical Center Alternate Care Site. Nonexpendable inventory will go to the Medical Counter Measures (MCM) Warehouse. The branch is also planning for space as supplies come back into the warehouse, specifically refrigerators, chairs, locking cabinets, and linen carts which were purchased by the State.
- Medical Logistics Branch and Department of Public Safety leadership toured the Department of Health lab yesterday. They discussed possible warehouse layouts and space requirements for test kit materials.

Economic Mitigation and Recovery Task Force

AGENCY OF COMMERCE AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT (ACCD):

- Interstate travel to and from New England and New York counties with 400 or fewer active COVID-19 cases per million is permitted without quarantine requirements. ACCD will update the cross state travel map each week as to which counties are permitted for travel to and from without quarantine. - Effective June 15, 2020 travelers may complete quarantine requirements in their home state before entering Vermont.



- **Tonight:** A slight chance of showers before 10pm, then a chance of showers after 2am. Cloudy, with a low around 63. South wind around 9 mph. Chance of precipitation is 30%. New precipitation amounts of less than a tenth of an inch possible.
- **Thursday:** Showers and thunderstorms before 4pm, then a chance of showers. Some of the storms could produce small hail, gusty winds, and heavy rain. High near 82. South wind 9 to 11 mph. Chance of precipitation is 80%. New rainfall amounts between a quarter and half of an inch possible.
