## Background / Current Situation

On June 15, 2020 the Vermont State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC) was partially activated from 0800 to 1600, using a completely virtual structure. The SEOC will be partially activated every day until further notice.

## **Key Updates:**

- The next meal distribution will be held on Tuesday, June 16th in Grand Isle County. The following distribution will be on Wednesday, June 17th in the Dover area. Pre-registration is required.
  - Registration, and the full list of dates and locations, can be found at <u>vem.vermont.gov/pods</u>
- Today, Governor Scott <u>amended and restated</u> Executive Order 01-20, extending the state of emergency until July 15th, 2020.
- <u>Updated guidance</u> from the Agency of Commerce and Community Development allows campgrounds, RV parks, and marinas to operate at 100% occupancy as long as other restrictions are followed.

These numbers are reported once daily covering a 24-period from midnight to midnight.

\*As of June 15th, this metric includes people who are being monitored in Sara Alert, which provides free daily symptom check reminders for 14 days while they are quarantining. There are two groups of people being monitored through Sara Alert:

- People traveling to Vermont from out of state. (Travelers are strongly encouraged to enroll.)
- Close contacts of people with COVID-19. (People who are identified as close contacts are enrolled unless they opt out.)

Sara Alert allows COVID-19 response teams to quickly and easily provide guidance to people if they develop symptoms. It is not GPS-based, so it does not monitor someone's movement or track their location. For more information about Sara Alert, visit the **travel page**.

#### 6/12-6/14 Call Statistics from 211:

- 211 received 62 calls related to COVID-19 on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. The vast majority of calls were from the general public (61 calls).
- The most common call topics were basic needs (31 calls, mostly signing up for the food distribution sites) and testing (16 calls) (topics are not mutually exclusive, i.e., calls can touch on multiple topics).

## Other Updates:

- The branch is planning for a worst case scenario, 180-day supply model, and how it will impact operations.
  - With additional items, the worst case scenario would need around another 10,000 sq ft of storage space (not including what else is on order, deployable assets, bathrooms, and not spacing out the pallets).
  - The new 10,000 ft suite the Medical Counter Measures (MCM) Warehouse just obtained is around 65% full already.

- The Child Development Division (CDD) is researching suppliers for gloves, hand sanitizer, and cleaning materials for childcare providers for large quantity purchases. CDD is meeting with a wholesale distributor on Tuesday to explore feasibility of opening the supply chain to child care providers.
- A small number of school superintendents are closing facilities for June and July out of abundance of caution, which may limit space available for child care and regulated summer programs. CDD is working with Department of Forests, Parks, and Recreation for possible solutions.

#### **Lifelines: Impacts and Actions**

#### · VSP is working with local police departments, the Department of Buildings and General Services, and a sheriff's department on traffic control and security at food distribution sites.

- VSP continues to monitor protest activities in Vermont.
- The Division of Fire Safety continues to dispense hand sanitizer to emergency response agencies.
- · The Urban Search and Rescue team will be providing cooling shelters at three Department of Health testing sites this week.
- · As states begin to lift their restrictions, travel could become more prevalent and lead to an increased risk of virus transmission. Changes to travel restrictions announced on Friday allow for travel to Vermont without quarantine restrictions from surrounding out-of-state counties that have low incidence of active COVID-19 cases.
- New Hampshire's Stay-At-Home order expires today, lifting restrictions on social gathering size among other directives.
- About 950 perishable household sets of food and milk were distributed on 6/12 at the Morristown food distribution site.
- It is estimated that about 770 perishable household sets of food and milk were distributed today (6/15) at the Lyndon food distribution site.
- The next meal distributions will take place on Tuesday, June 16<sup>th</sup> in Grand Isle County and on Wednesday, June 17<sup>th</sup> in the Dover area, both from 10am-2pm. The distribution will consist of perishable F2F meals only, and pre-registration is required. No personal information will be collected.
- · The Agency of Education is finalizing school health guidance for distribution, produced jointly with the Department of Health.
- The Child Development Division is meeting with a wholesale distributor tomorrow (6/16) for possible large quantity purchases of gloves, hand sanitizer, and cleaning materials for childcare providers.

#### · Interstate travel to and from New England and New York counties with 400 or fewer active COVID-19 cases per million is permitted without quarantine requirements. ACCD will update the cross state travel map each week as to which counties are permitted for travel to and from without quarantine. Map was updated today.

- Effective today (6/15), travelers may complete quarantine requirements in their home state before entering Vermont.
  - Public transportation is not running under normal operations, and it is unclear when this would return to standard conditions. As industries begin to open up the current social distancing protocols may prove to be challenging on bus routes.



Incident Summary

A novel coronavirus (SARS-CoV-2) was first detected in China at the end of 2019. It has now spread to almost every country, with the largest number of cases in the United States. The disease the virus causes has been named "coronavirus disease 2019" (abbreviated "COVID-19").

- At today's press conference, Department of Health Commissioner Levine said that the Serology Working Group discourages use of serology (i.e., antibody) tests at the individual level. Though there are now highly accurate serology tests, the low prevalence of COVID-19 in Vermont means most positive results will still be false positives. Serology tests are potentially useful for population-level surveys, but no such surveys are currently planned in Vermont.
