Incident Summary

Key Information

A novel coronavirus (SARS-CoV-2) was first detected in China at the end of 2019. It has now spread to almost every country, with the largest number of cases in the United States. The disease the virus causes has been named "coronavirus disease 2019" (abbreviated "COVID-19").

Key Updates:

 An estimated 54.7% of Vermonter households have completed the 2020 census so far - only four other states have lower completion rates. Census data informs political representation and federal funding (including for COVID-19 response), so it is paramount to have an accurate understanding of Vermont's population. The census can be completed online or by calling 844-330-2020.

• There are 114 cases of COVID-19 associated with an outbreak in Winooksi and the surrounding communities. The State is providing testing and wrap-around services to residents.

Lifelines: Impacts and Actions

- On Thursday, there will be a pop-up testing site for asymptomatic members of the public in Burlington, Barre, St. Albans, and White River Junction. Registration for Barre, St. Albans, and White River Junction is full. More such testing sites for the Offense-Minded Testing Strategy are currently planned through 7/31. Available appointments at pop-up testing clinics are filling quickly.
- One Alternate Care Site is currently operating in Chittenden County with no patients and one other site is on standby in Rutland County.
- There are 12 COVID-19 cases associated with a workplace in the Fairhaven area. Testing of workers is ongoing, and there will be broader community testing later this week.
- There is a cluster of COVID-19 cases in Windham County, limited to a small number of people with familial connections. Testing is
- The Department of Corrections plans on conducting facility-wide COVID-19 testing at one correctional facility per week, even if there are not confirmed cases at the facility.
- Today there is facility-wide COVID-19 testing at Chittenden County Regional Correctional Facility, after a newly arrived inmate tested positive. Results are expected tomorrow.
- On Tuesday, a newly arrived inmate at Northwest State Correctional Facility tested positive for COVID-19. An investigation into whether there were exposures is ongoing.

• The Medical Logistics Branch of the SEOC is working with the Logistics Branch and the Department of Buildings and General Services on obtaining additional long-term warehouse space, to support the procurement, reception, staging, and storage of a 180day supply of PPE.

Other Lifelines

• The Agency of Commerce and Community Development is working to get the Economic Recovery and Relief Grant system in place. The agency is working toward a single digital entry point for businesses who will then be funneled appropriately to the application they need to get their grant, as well as an associated call center.

· Planning continues for the next phase of the Farmers to Family food distribution. It is anticipated that this phase will begin on 7/6. The Agency of Education submitted an application to the USDA to

- extend Disaster Household Distribution approval for Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP) foods for an additional 30 days, though 7/30.
- Interstate travel to and from New England and New York counties with 400 or fewer active COVID-19 cases per million is permitted without quarantine requirements. ACCD will update the cross-state travel map each week as to which counties are permitted for travel to and from without quarantine.
- Public transportation is not running under normal operations, and it is unclear when this would return to standard conditions. As industries begin to open up the current social distancing protocols may prove to be challenging on bus routes.
