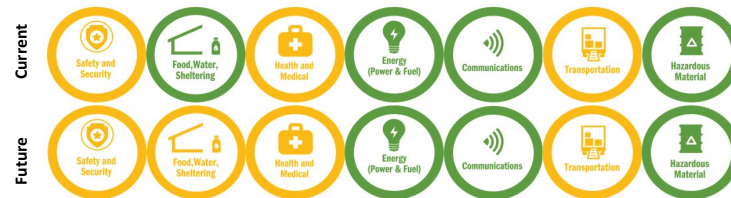

Incident Summary
<p>A novel coronavirus (SARS-CoV-2) was first detected in China at the end of 2019. It has now spread to almost every country, with the United States having the largest number of cases. The disease the virus causes has been named “coronavirus disease 2019” (abbreviated “COVID-19”).</p>

<p>Current case status in Vermont, last updated by the Health Department at 1100 on 4/22/20:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Positive test results: 823 Total tests conducted: 13,462 Deaths: 40 Hospitalized patients with COVID-19: 18 Hospitalized patients under investigation for COVID-19: 19 <p>Key Updates: The Vermont Foodbank and the Vermont National Guard began distributing food to those in need in Franklin County today, the first of five locations around the state that will be used for distribution. The National Guard has set up and is operating Points of Distribution (PODs) at state airports in Swanton, North Clarendon, Newport, Bennington, and North Springfield on separate days over the next two weeks. Those in need of food can go to these locations on the appointed days and receive a seven-day supply of Meals Ready-to-Eat (MRE) for each member of their household. Dates and locations can be found at vem.vermont.gov/pods.</p> <p>Executive Order Measures: On April 17th, Governor Scott announced Addendum 10 which outlines a phased reopening of businesses in Vermont, and mandatory health & safety guidance that will be required of all businesses currently operation and those re-starting:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Phased opening of businesses not defined as <i>essential</i> started yesterday. Subject to mandatory health and safety requirements, the following operations will be allowed to restart: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Outdoor Businesses & Construction Operations Retail Operations; all orders must occur over the phone; no in-store transactions re allowed at this time. Low- or no-contact professional services such as appraisers, realtors, municipal clerks, attorneys, property managers, pet care operators, and others. <p>Local State of Emergency: Burlington, Colchester, Johnson, Rutland, Vernon.
