#### Background / Current Situation

On May 11, 2020 the Vermont State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC) was fully activated from 0800 to 1600, using a completely virtual structure. The SEOC will be fully activated during the week and partially activated through the weekend until further notice.

#### **Thermometer Updates:**

 The SNS Warehouse and the Agency of Transportation are coordinating a distribution plan for the remaining State inventory of infrared thermometers (the original distribution was delayed to accommodate the addition of masks to the distribution).

#### Other Updates:

- The SNS Warehouse received its anticipated deliveries of N95 masks, surgical masks, cloth face coverings, and face shields.
- The SNS Warehouse is working on finalizing details of the lease for additional space. There are differing approaches regarding managing the increased capacity requirements of SNS inventory.
- The SNS Warehouse is working on a shipment of Remdesivir from FEMA which will require refrigeration. The shipment was not delivered over the weekend as originally anticipated. The actual delivery date is unknown.
- A portion of the HEPA filters requested from FEMA were received. The branch is looking into what part of the Resource Request Forms this fills to see if the filters should go to UVM or the State.
- The branch is working on products used for inventory and forecasting for PPE items to make the
  process less manual. This will help with the change in branch responsibilities when military
  members' orders end.
- The branch is coordinating the PPE delivery from the White House Task Force (WHTF) to nursing homes. It looks like the shipments will be diverted to the SNS Warehouse to allow for quality control of the contents, and then distributed to nursing homes designated by WHTF.

Logistics Branch

#### Resource procurement status:

- The assessments of courthouses for plexiglass barriers were completed. The branch is working with the Judiciary on follow up.
- Oxygen Saturation Devices are due to arrive at UVM Medical Center by Friday, 5/15.
- 1,500 additional infrared thermometers were ordered by UVM Medical Center. Expected delivery is Friday, 5/15.
- The branch is working on portable restrooms and a hand washing station for the pop-up testing sites throughout the state.

#### Vermont National Guard (VTNG):

VTNG is supporting the pop-up testing sites across the state.

#### Department of Human Resources (DHR):

- Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) medical volunteer activity:
  - 60 volunteers, 8 of whom are deployed at 2 locations, including 7 volunteers deployed at Northeast Vermont Regional Hospital.

#### Hospital resource needs

- The SEOC is working to secure specific resource requests for three all-day, by-appointment-only pop-up testing operations in Bennington on 5/12, in Brattleboro on 5/14, and in White River Junction on 5/16 for all first responders, healthcare workers, and childcare providers. More such testing for the Offense-minded Testing Strategy is planned for the next several weeks.
- The SEOC/HOC are embarking on an aggressive campaign to use the eight Steris V-PRO sterilizers for N-95 respirator sterilization. The hospitals with donated sterilizers are Brattleboro Memorial Hopsital, Southern Vermont Medical Center, Northeastern Vermont Medical Center, Springfield Hospital, UVM Medical Center, Rutland Regional Medical Center, and North Country Hospital.
- The branch will reinforce the use of KN95 respirators from China to allow for new respiratory protection users and to extend PPE supplies.


