The addendum also allows for social gatherings of up to 25 people in any confined indoor or outdoor spaces (also effective June 1<sup>st</sup>) but does not change the occupancy limits previously established for businesses, non-profits, and government entities.</li> <li>Today, the Agency of Commerce and Community Development updated its reopening guidance, provided health measures are followed:             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Organized outdoor markets, such as flea markets, can resume.</li> <li>Pick-your-own agricultural produces can resume.</li> <li>Overnight summer camps and limited residential summer college programming can operate.
