Safety and Security	Current Situation
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> VSP is working with local police departments, the Department of Buildings and General Services, and a sheriff's department on traffic control and security at food distribution sites. Urban Search and Rescue deployed a shelter, HVAC, and three personnel to assist with a cooling station at the Rutland testing site. VSP continues to monitor protest activities in Vermont. The Division of Fire Safety is continuing to dispense hand sanitizer to emergency response agencies.
Future	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> As states begin to lift their restrictions, travel could become more prevalent and lead to an increased risk of virus transmission. Changes to travel restrictions announced on Friday allow for travel to Vermont without quarantine restrictions from surrounding out-of-state counties that have low incidence of active COVID-19 cases.
Food, Water, Sheltering	Current Situation
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> It is estimated that over 800 perishable household sets and milk were distributed today at the Middlebury food distribution site (numbers are not final). The next meal distributions will take place on Thursday, June 11th, 10am-2pm in the Brattleboro area and on Friday, June 12th in the Morrystown area. These will provide perishable F2F meals only, and pre-registration is required. No personal information will be collected. The Agency of Education is working with the Vermont Department of Health on guidance for reopening schools and a resource request for school food service programs.
Future	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Abbey Group's Farmers-to-Families contract to supply food boxes was extended through August 2020. Additional Vermont fresh produce and dairy products will be included in this next stage of the contract. A modified distribution plan will be implemented after the current large-scale direct distributions finish.
Transportation	Current Situation
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Interstate travel to and from New England and New York counties with 400 or fewer active COVID-19 cases per million is permitted without quarantine requirements. ACCD will update the cross state travel map each week as to which counties are permitted for travel to and from without quarantine. AOT is staffing border crossings for the State's monitoring of traffic mobility to determine how effective mitigation measures are for reducing travel and also to give healthcare leaders a sense of future healthcare capacity needs. All vehicles (Vermont and out-of-state) are being counted; license plate numbers are not being recorded. For more info: https://vtrans.vermont.gov/vtransparency
Future	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Effective June 15, 2020, travelers may complete quarantine requirements in their home state before entering Vermont. Public transportation is not running under normal operations, and it is unclear when this would return to standard conditions. As industries begin to open up the current social distancing protocols may prove to be challenging on bus routes.

Health and Medical	Current Situation
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> There are 74 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in the ongoing outbreak in Winooski and the surrounding communities. There are no reports of hospitalizations or deaths associated with the outbreak. The State is providing testing and wrap-around services to residents. Registration is required for testing. Tomorrow, there will be a pop-up testing site for asymptomatic members of the public in Burlington, Winooski, Barre, St. Albans, and White River Junction. More such testing sites for the Offense-Minded Testing Strategy are currently planned through June 26th. Available appointments at pop-up testing clinics are filling quickly. One Alternate Care Site is currently operating in Chittenden County with one other site on standby in Rutland County. The Chittenden County site currently has no patients. The Alternate Care Site in Burlington is in the process of being demobilized. This should be completed by the end of the week. 	
Future	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Medical Logistics Branch of the SEOC is looking into how best to support the PPE needs of municipalities as they hold elections.
Other Lifelines	Current Situation
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Local Support and Community Action Team released its Interim Report to the Governor on recommendations for social and economic recovery. The report was informed with input from thousands of community leaders, state officials, and individuals across Vermont. Agency of Digital Services staff solved the major network and general connectivity issues with Department of Public Safety (DPS) network. Service is now restored.
Future	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> There are currently minimal power outages across the state.
