Yosemite Firehouse Grant: The grant has been applied for and will be used to finish the restoration to the exterior. The only thing left to the exterior will be painting it. The land around the building has been acquired and plans are being drawn up.

Academy Building: The slate for the roof is at the building and the repairs will start next spring.

ARPA Funds: Heather Chase would like to see if some funds can be used to purchase the solar field after the contract is up in 2022. Julie Hance will ask VLCT if this would be possible. They have hired a person to vet the ideas towns have for use of the money. The solar field information will be added to the Agenda in January. Julie Hance will check on the date the contract ends and possibly have an Executive Session to discuss the matter.

Town Hall Construction: The flooring has been ripped up and a down payment has been put down on the new carpet. The 2022 budget will include more items needed to finish it up.
