# Chester Historic Preservation Committee

**Facilities Director.** This year the Town hired a Facilities Director to oversee all Town Buildings, including the historic ones. This new position should help ensure that regular maintenance needs are addressed. It is a welcome and positive step toward coordinating and scheduling repairs efficiently.

**Hearse Museum.** This unique, seasonal museum – featuring the Town’s handsome hearse and displays about funeral customs – is open in good weather through Columbus Day.

**Academy Building.** The west side of the slate roof was fixed earlier this year, but Covid effects on labor and supply chains continue to adversely impact attempts to secure workers for plaster repairs to the interior of the building.

**Whiting Library.** Small repairs to the heater and sprinkler system are being scheduled.

**Town Hall.** The Town is waiting for a quote for changes to the upstairs sound system that would include a proposed new wireless system.

**Yosemite Fire House.** With architectural design plans for the future museum and its adjacent parking lot in hand, plus a recent bid for repairs to the windows, the Town submitted a grant application on October 2 for a \$20,000 matching grant from the State of Vermont. Besides repair to the existing windows, the grant request would help cover new storm windows, renovation of the two sliding doors, and fabrication of double doors behind the sliders on the south side of the building. The proposed new door on the north side of the building and painting of the exterior need to be done to fully protect the shell of the building and to allow better access, but repair of the windows and the sliding-door complex will go a long way toward protecting the shell and advancing the museum plans.

Meanwhile the Committee continues to seek memorabilia and information to tell the story of the Chester Fire Department in that historic structure. ## Town Health Officer's Message

2022 has been a busy year for Dogs Running at Large, Potentially Vicious Dogs, and Nuisance Dogs. To protect the health and safety of the residents of Chester, please make sure your dog is always secured on your property. Some information from the TOC Dog Ordinance are as follows:

- Potentially Vicious Dog means a dog running at large that inflicts minor injuries on a person not necessitating medical attention: chases, threatens to attack or attack another domestic pet or animal, chases a person, or causes any person to reasonably fear attack or bodily injury from such dog.
- Running at Large is when the dog is NOT:
  - on a leash, in a vehicle, on the owner's premises, on the premises of another person with permission, clearly under the verbal or non-verbal control of the owner
- Dogs over 4 months of age are to be registered by April 1<sup>st</sup> every year
