17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24	Lee moved and Ben seconded a motion to approve the July 6 <sup>th</sup> minutes. Heather asked for any changes, corrections, or omissions. Lee had a question about page 1, line 39, where it said, "they didn't stop" and he wondered if it should say "she didn't stop" or if it was the vehicle that didn't stop. Julie said it was the cyclist that didn't stop. Leigh said it had happened again the past week where someone on a bicycle came down High Street and never braked and rode into the intersection. - 6 is in but not the railing. The boardwalk will take them to the stone wall and is the part being done.

- is faded. Heather asked if it would be done by Fall and Julie hoped it would be received by then.

- 19 Lee and Julie met with Green Lantern. They have received their modeling. Julie had a few
- 20 questions regarding the price. She will have an update at the next meeting, and it will be listed as
- an agenda item at that time to present what they are offering.
- Heather asked if there were any questions and there were none.

#### Agenda Item 4, Police Chief Retirement

- 24 There was a letter in their packets. Julie said Rick Cloud had submitted his notice for retirement
- effective January 7<sup>th</sup>, as it is the end of a payroll period and made sense. She thanked him and said
- 26 he will be part of the process for the new hire, starting mid-August. Jim Baker will help with the
- 27 process. The legal process has changed, and Jim will help. Julie will update them at the next
- meeting with more information and details. Rick has worked for Chester for 20 years and in law
- 29 enforcement for over 30 and has contributed a lot. Heather agreed. In his letter, he mentioned he
- would be willing to assist with the process.

#### **Agenda Item 5, Police Department Assessment Update**

- 32 Julie said Jim Baker is wrapping things up. There is a survey out now and it is on social media,
- there's a link on the website, and it's been emailed to schools asking them to send it to their groups.
- 34 They are trying to reach as many as possible. This is the last piece of data collection with Jim. The
- report is well under way, and he just wants to gather this last bit of comment from the community.
- 36 It will be completed hopefully by mid-August. It times well with Rick giving his retirement notice.
- 37 Jim has gotten a good feel from the community about what people like about the police department
- and where they would like to see them go and what community policing means to them. Jim has
- 39 gotten a lot of good feedback. They are pretty much ready to go to start a search process. The
- 40 report will come to the members. Julie thought Jim would likely give a presentation of the report

1 at a future meeting.

2 Heather asked if there were any questions from the board and there were none.

# Agenda Item 6, Vehicle Purchase for Facilities Director

Julie said it was great having Steve, the Facilities Director, on staff and he was accomplishing a lot, but she realized he needed a vehicle. The Water Department budgeted a new truck which is on order. Their current truck still has good life and Steve only needs a vehicle to go around town from one building to the other. They decided they could purchase the vehicle from the Water Department since it's a separate fund and Steve could get several more years out of it. The price they were going to offer for the truck as a trade-in was \$11,500. Because the water fund is healthy with its fund balance, instead of borrowing it from themselves and paying interest, she wanted to budget it for the 2023 budget where they make a payment to the water fund and not borrow and there would be no interest. It would just be an inhouse exchange. The members agreed it was a great idea. She didn't need a motion but only wanted to know that they were okay with it.

## Agenda Item 7, Park and Ride Grant

Julie is going to apply for the grant for resurfacing the parking area. It cannot be used to create the path. She needed board approval via a motion to apply for it because it will go on the state website as a park and ride location. It could potentially be used by people that weren't residents of Chester or visiting the shops. It could be used by people carpooling. She wanted to make sure they were okay with doing it. Ben asked if there were requirements for extra lighting. Julie said they felt the lighting was sufficient. Ben moved to approve applying for the municipal park and ride grant and Leigh seconded it. Heather asked for further discussion. Having parked his vehicle at other park and rides in the state, Lee thought it was a great idea and was all for it but wondered if there were any negative repercussions of having random people parking in town and if there were any issues at other park and rides in the state that they should be aware of going into this. Julie said she didn't know but didn't think it would be used as heavily as one along the interstate. Ben said currently it was a parking area open to the public. He asked if there would be signage and Julie said there would be, which they were going to have anyway because it's the overflow parking for The Green. The only real change would be the advertisement on the state's website. It is already on the state's website for the charging station. She wasn't sure how much more traffic it would produce. It was a way to get it resurfaced. Heather thought the additional awareness could be positive by bringing more people to town. Julie agreed. Julie said the only thing left would be getting the path to The Green. When they did the Wayfinding Plan, a kiosk will be at that location directing people to The Green. A vote was taken, and the motion passed unanimously.

## Agenda Item 8, New Business/Next Agenda

Julie said when the charging stations were installed, they had to provide for charging for free for 1 to 3 years because they were installed with a grant. They are beyond that time. She pulled electrical usage of the stations which average between \$100 and \$200 a month. When they installed the units, they made sure there was the ability to start charging people fees. They are reaching out to the company to figure out how they go about doing it. The program she was told they could utilize, the company would collect the payments, withhold their fee, and issue a check to Chester at the end of the month. That's the process they want to use and currently use with credit cards here. Lee has an electric car and has used the charging station a couple of times. It is great, easy to access, and internet is available there. He went to a neighboring community who also has a free

- 1 electric vehicle charging station with no Wi-Fi or internet so he couldn't use it. He thought it was
- 2 a great addition to town and a good opportunity for them to attract people looking for a place to
- 3 plug in their car and do some shopping. He didn't think they should give electric away. Lee did a
- 4 trip to Maine on July 4<sup>th</sup> and had to charge twice on the trip. Both charges took about 30 minutes
- 5 and got him from 40% to 80%, which was enough to get him home. It is a great opportunity for
- 6 people to come and charge their car and wander around The Green. Heather suggested discussing
- 7 later the cost of continuing it and if they want to charge and how much. And maybe they would
- 8 know about their solar farm by then.
- 9 Heather asked for any other new business or agenda items.
- Julie said she had put an ad out for the local cannabis commission due to Robert Nied's resignation
- and hoped to get some interest.
- 12 They will be discussing replacement of the water main on Depot Street. It's a big project that needs
- to be done and they were hoping to line it up with the sidewalk project since the road will be dug
- 14 up.
- 15 Heather asked if there were any other items or concerns and there were none.

### 16 Agenda Item 9, Adjourn

- Lee moved and Leigh seconded to adjourn the meeting. A vote was taken, and the motion passed
- unanimously, and the meeting was adjourned at 6:54 p.m.
