Arne Jonynas read Barbara Bye's complaint about the incident that happened on July 20, 2021. She was walking down Davidson Hill Road when Dutches came at her and bit her on the leg. Ann & Michael Cefola submitted a letter explaining an encounter they had with the same dog. Carl Hurd spoke about his family and a few of their encounters with Dutches not being leashed and coming into their yard. He called the police after the first incident. He would like the Select Board to see if the complaint is on file. Mitchell Horton was served paperwork giving notice of the Vicious Dog Hearing for his dog Duthces and was not in attendance. Amanda Silva explained she wrote letters to Mitchell Horton before the bite happened. She was able to speak with him one time and asked him to keep his dog on a leash. Dutches rabies shot was verified and is up to date, but the dog has not been registered with the town. Caroline Ebelt stated she is worried the owner

will not comply with any type of conditions and does not trust him. Adam Trojanowski is Mitchell Horton's landlord and owner of the property where the dog lives. He stated Dutches has been on the property since about April 1, 2021. He was contacted by someone that was concerned about the dog and after, called the police station to see about complaints. There were no complaints on record at that time. Gregg Nader asked what the towns responsibility is if the dog stays on the property. Julie Hance explained the town attorney advised if the dog owner does not follow through with the Select Board's decision, any further incidents fall on the owner of the dog. Mitchell Horton does not seem to be taking this matter seriously and Amanda Silva does not think he will comply with conditions form the outcome of the hearing. Arne Jonynas stated the Select Board must decide if the dog is a vicious dog or a potentially vicious dog.

A motion was made by Lee Gustafson to enter Deliberative Session at the end of the meeting. Seconded by Heather Chase. The hearing was closed at 7:02 p.m.

VICIOUS DOG HEARING FINDINGS, CONCLUSIONS AND DECISION/PROTECTIVE ORDER

Town of Chester Selectboard

In re: Dutchess

Complainants: Barbara L. Bye Owners/Keepers: Mitchell Horton

INTRODUCTION AND PROCEDURAL HISTORY

- 1. This proceeding involves a vicious dog complaint submitted by Barbara Bye (hereinafter "Bye") and received by the Town of Chester on July 26, 2021.
- 2. A public notice of a hearing on this vicious dog complaint was posted in the Chester Town Clerk's office, Chester Hardware, and the Chester Post Office, and was sent to each Chester Selectboard member on August 10, 2021. Public notice was also posted on the Town of Chester website and Facebook page on the same date.
- 3. On August 10, 2021, notice of this vicious dog hearing was personally served by the Chester Police Department upon Mitchell Horton (hereinafter "Horton") Owners/Keepers of Dutchess.
- 4. On August 10, 2021, notice of this vicious dog hearing was mailed to Bye, Complainant.
- 5. The hearing on the Complaint was set for, and held on, August 18, 2021. Present at the hearing were the following Selectboard members:
 - Arne Jonynas, Chair
 - Heather Chase
 - Leigh Dakin
 - Lee Gustafson
- 6. During the course of the hearing, the following exhibits were submitted and accepted by the Chester Selectboard:
 - Exhibit A Notice to Owner of Vicious Dog Hearing dated 08/10/2021
 - Exhibit B Communication from Health Officer
 - Exhibit C Police Report

- 7. The following individuals provided verbal testimony under oath:
 - Barbara Bye; Caroline Ebelt; Carl Hurd; Adam Trojanowski; Amanda Silva; Jack Cable

FINDINGS OF FACT

Based on the evidence and exhibits submitted during the hearing, the testimony of witnesses at the hearing and other evidence of record, the Selectboard hereby makes the following findings of fact:

- 1. Dutchess is a domestic pet currently residing (renting) at 659 Davidson Hill Road with his Owner/Keeper Horton.
- 2. Dutchess is not registered in the Town of Chester.
- 3. The property identified as 659 Davidson Hill Road is owned by Adam Trojanowski and under the management of River Valley Property Management.
- 4. The lease of Horton expires on August 31, 2021.
- 5. On July 20, 2021, Bye was walking on Davidson Hill Road with her daughter and granddaughter when they were charged by Dutchess (a German Shepard). Bye was bit on her upper thigh.
- 6. During this incident, Dutchess was not controlled by a leash and was off the Horton residence property and in the right of way of Davidson Hill Road.
- 7. It has been determined that Dutchess is current on all rabies vaccinations.
- 8. An anonymous complaint filed with the Health Officer on July 22, 20201 (Exhibit G) described an additional bite by Dutchess.
- 9. Carl Hurd (hereinafter "Hurd") testified that he has experienced issues with Dutchess charging him and trying to bite him. Hurd was able to fend off Dutchess with a ski pole.
- 10. Email communication from Cefola (Exhibit H) indicates experiences with being "charged" by Dutchess.
- 11. Horton indicated to the Health Officer that Dutchess is a "service dog" and is "at his side at all times,"
- 12. During all incidents testified to verbally and in writing, Horton was not present with Dutchess during the encounters.
- 13. The neighboring property owners of Davidson Hill Road have expressed their reasonable fears that if Dutchess is not under control and restrained AT ALL TIMES, she will again attack those walking on Davidson Hill Road.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the above stated Findings of Fact, the Selectboard concludes as follows:

- 1. Mrs. Bye, as Complainant, has filed a vicious dog complaint in connection with an incident that occurred on July 22, 2021 involving Dutchess, an unregistered dog, who attacked her while she was walking on Davidson Hill Road.
- 2. The Town of Chester has a duly enacted Ordinance for the Control of Dogs and Wolf-Hybrids that became effective as of August 18, 2015 (hereinafter "ordinance").
- 3. Under Section 12 A. of the Ordinance, when a dog has bitten a person on or off the premises of its owner or keeper and the person bitten requires medical attention, that person may file a written complaint with the Selectboard. If the Selectboard determines that the person has been bitten without provocation, the Selectboard may "make such order for the protection of persons as the facts and circumstances may require, including, without limitation, that the dog is disposed of in a humane way, muzzled, chained or confined." Ordinance at Section 12 C.
- 4. The Selectboard is similarly conferred with the express authority to investigate vicious dog complaints of unprovoked dog bites requiring medical attention pursuant to 20 VSA §3546 occurring off the premises of the owner. In this instance, the Selectboard concludes that the premises in fee where the attack occurred is owned by the Town of Chester and is a public right of way.
- 5. Dutchess is a "domestic pet" as defined by 20 VSA §3541(3) and a "dog" as defined by Section 3 A, of the Ordinance.
- 6. By its own terms, 20 VSA §3546(a) and (c) requires that any protective order be based on the biting of a "victim" who is a "person" without provocation. The facts in this case indicate that Dutchess' attack on Bye was on a "person" and "without provocation".
- 7. Pursuant to Section 12 of the Ordinance, the Selectboard concludes that Dutchess is a vicious dog which allows it to order any protective measures. Given the severity of the attack, the injuries sustained by Barbara Bye, and the evident animosity displayed by Dutchess toward walkers on Davidson Hill Road, the Selectboard concludes that every and all steps should to be taken to assure that Dutchess is, and remains at all times, restrained during any period in which Dutchess is present in the Town of Chester.

PROTECTIVE ORDER

Based on the foregoing facts and conclusions, the Selectboard hereby orders that the domestic pet named Dutchess, owned by Mitchell Horton, be immediately impounded in accordance with Section 11 of the Ordinance, with remedial actions as follows:

- 1. Dutchess will be immediately impounded by the Chester Animal Control officer or any officer of the Chester Police Department and held pending compliance with items 2 through 4, inclusive, as follows:
- 2. Registration with the Town Clerk's Office in Chester, Vermont.
- 3. Proof of installation of a secure chain and muzzle system at any property where Dutchess will be residing.
- 4. Behavioral assessment by a licensed professional indicating that Dutchess is safe to return to a residential area.
 - In accordance with Section 11 of the Ordinance, if remedial actions 2 through 4 above are completed and Dutchess is returned to Horton, the following will apply:
- 5. At all times that Dutchess is not controlled inside the Horton residence, she shall be muzzled, securely leashed, and under the direct physical control of Horton.
- 6. Unless Dutchess is securely leashed and under the direct physical control of Horton, she shall not be chained or secured in any way that is visible from Davidson Hill Road.
- 7. In the event Dutchess is at any time found by others to be loose or at large, they will immediately contact and alert the Chester Police Department.
- 8. In the event that Dutchess is found to be loose or running at large, she shall be immediately impounded by the Chester Animal Control officer or any officer of the Chester Police Department and held pending further hearing and order by the Chester Selectboard or any court of competent jurisdiction.

Failure to comply fully with the conditions set forth in this Protective Order shall subject the Owners/Keepers to any and all penalties and remedies as provided by law and the Ordinance including, but not limited to, the domestic pet known as Dutchess being humanely destroyed.
