Southeastern Vermont Community Action is an anti-poverty, community based, nonprofit organization serving Windham and Windsor counties since 1965.

Our mission is to enable people to cope with and reduce the hardships of poverty; create sustainable self-sufficiency; reduce the causes and move toward the elimination of poverty. SEVCA has a variety of programs and services to meet this end. They include: Head Start, Weatherization, Emergency Home Repair, Housing Stabilization, Emergency Services/Crisis Intervention (i.e., fuel/utility assistance, food, shelter), Parent Education, Micro-Business Development, Individual Development Accounts, Tax Preparation, Training, Working Bridges, and Thrift Stores.

In the community of Chester we have provided the following services during FY2011:

Weatherization: 10 homes (26 people) weatherized at a cost of \$87,026
Emergency Heating Replacements: 1 repair or replacement at a cost of \$3,051
Head Start: 20 families (74 people) received comprehensive child development and family support services valued at \$153,939

Micro Business Development: 5 households (9 people) received counseling, technical assistance and support to start, sustain or expand a small business, valued at \$7,316

Tax Preparation: 1 household (1 person) received refunds and tax credits totaling \$291
 Thrift Store Vouchers: 8 households (18 people) received goods and services valued at \$693
 Family Services: 70 households (175 people) received 302 services (including crisis intervention, financial counseling, nutrition education, referral to and assistance with accessing needed services) valued at \$2,904

Fuel/Utility Assistance: 91 households (213 people) received services valued at \$59,992
 Housing & Other Assistance: 5 household (14 people) received services valued at \$3,322
 Emergency Home Repair: 5 homes (7 people) received services to address health and safety risks, repair structural problems, and reduce energy waste, valued at \$8,120

Training: 5 people received training /certification in "green" technologies, computer skills, business startup, or management skills, valued at \$5,230

Community support, through town funding, helps to build a strong partnership. The combination of federal, state, private and town funds allow us to not only maintain, but increase and improve service.
