

Old Brookside Cemetery Plot Plan

(Arrow at right side of map points north to Main Street)

To make the cemetery plot plan as large as possible, the handwritten notes at the bottom of the map, which was glued to fabric, are not included on the map photograph, but are recorded below.

Revised Sept. 12, 1961 By Dufresne – Henry Engr. Corp.
Lots added – 19-22A, 18-20B, 10-15D, 10-15E

The drawing was copied from old paper drawing pasted on cloth and dated Sept. 20, 1867 by Lewis Locke of cemetery at South Street, Chester, Vermont with such additions and corrections made by checking some distances and information given by Mr. Charles Pierce (caretaker) Chester, Vt April 1933. Aforementioned drawing held for further reference at the office of the Town Clerk, Chester, Vermont.

The old drawing also has the following memoranda written below:

“Plan of new Burying Ground in Chester South Street drawn to a scale of 16 feet to an inch as surveyed Sept. 20th, 1867 by me.

Notes

The lots that are curved at the corners are curved on a radius of eleven feet and the curves commence six feet from the corners of the lots that are cut off.

The lots were measured off commencing at the south line of the new Burying Ground and measuring from that.

The lots south and adjoining the north driveway won't all of them hold out in size quite what they are marked.
